TOWN OFFICER'S REPORTS

Councilman Heitzenrater reported that he has been attending meetings of the *Greater Falconer Area Economic Development Committee*. He updated the Town Council re the committee's plans for commercial development in Falconer.

Mr. Heitzenrater also commented on a recent article in the *Jamestown Post-Journal* concerning pay increases for *City of Jamestown* police officers.

Mr. Heitzenrater also enquired about the status of an abandoned house on Avalon Blvd. Supervisor McLaughlin stated that the owner of the abandoned property has been cited for code violations and will be appearing in the Ellicott Town Court in the near future.

Town Clerk Erlandson reported that the project to construct a custom glass partition and install a panic alarm security system in the Town Clerk's office should get underway in the next several weeks. (Minutes 3/19/18)

Supervisor McLaughlin reported that he and several other town officers met with *Jamestown Board of Public Utilities* officials last week to continue negotiations re a new water and sewer agreement with the *City of Jamestown*. (Minutes 8/21/17 et. seq.) According to Mr. McLaughlin, both parties have agreed in principle to the terms of a new agreement. However, he explained that the agreement will have to be approved by the entire *BPU* board as well as *Jamestown City Council* before it is finalized. Councilman Heitzenrater asked several questions pertaining to the proposed agreement.

Mr. McLaughlin also reported that he recently attended a *Chautauqua Co. Mayors and Supervisors Association* meeting. At the meeting, he was informed that the *Chautauqua Co. Dept. of Public Facilities* intends to dredge certain portions of *Chautauqua Lake* in 2019. He stated that county officials are looking for locations to deposit the dredging material which consists mainly of silt & gravel. He added that the county has offered to give the material away for free to any municipality that would be interested in accepting it. Mr. McLaughlin noted that the Town of Ellicott might be able to utilize some of the material at *Burtis Bay Park*. He pointed out that although this wouldn't take place until next year county officials are looking for commitments from municipalities in advance of the dredging. He stated that further details concerning the dredging project are forthcoming. He will keep the Council apprised of further developments.

Mr. McLaughlin also reported that he recently met with *Chautauqua Co. Industrial Development Agency (CCIDA)* officials concerning its frequent lack of transparency relative to actions or pilot programs the agency is considering – particularly those that would affect
